In second grade, too, we all received our very First Holy Communion and learned how to make our first confession.

It seemed as if the years had flown by, but we were just starting the third grade here in St. Michael's as our teacher, Mrs. Louise Riley, helped us through to the very end. Joining our class of that year was Richard Redano, who is still with us till this day.

Now half way through grade school at St. Michael's we had no new recruits. In this same year, we began to learn our History, and Geography taught to us by Mrs. Kathy Gardner. Here everyone passed and was ready for the summer ahead.

Coming along the stretch, Lee, Whit, Cary, and Michael joined us on our way to the end of our St. Michael's education. Here we all received our first Confirmation under Sister Bernard Marie, whose job was later taken by Sister Patricia Martin.

The only new recruit to join us in the sixth grade was Paul Corriveau. Under Mr. Sidney Cawn, we enjoyed our last class before going to class in the trailors.

Now, under Miss Delores Pflumn for the first time, Darcel, Bogden, Susan Hill, and Debbie attended the seventh grade with us. In this year we had three teachers, one after another in this order. First Miss Pflumn, who left at Christmas time, then Father Daniel who later left, and for the latter part of the year Mr. Rabadeau.

Now after all these years, we finally reach the eighth grade, where we are to graduate. Joining us to make up the class of 70' were Holt, Nancy, Mark, Jane, and Payton. Mr. Rabadeau continued as our eighth grade teacher. As eight graders we were presented with many challanges. All of which have added to our educational growth.

Our Principal in our last year was Sister Patricia, whose help enabled us to enjoy a memorable class trip to Daytona Beach, Florida.
